Arts for Mental Health Conference - Video Editor (\$4500)

Mississauga Arts Council (MAC) and Mass Culture/ Mobilisation culturelle (MC) brought together health practitioners, academics, artists, politicians, and leaders in the arts sector at the first Arts for Mental Health Conference in Canada on October 6, 2021. MAC is seeking a video editor to produce multiple video segments from the 4 hour ZOOM recording.

About this position:

Working closely with MAC, the video editor will add lower thirds, cut long pauses, add title cards and logos/graphics, and enhance sound and polish as needed.

Videos requested include:

- An archival version of the 4 hour conference
- The full conference cut into the 3 “acts” or sections of the conference (3 videos)
- A highlights video that summarizes the conference content and best quotes in under 20 minutes
- A short trailer summarizing the top 3 key points of the conference
- A short trailer summarizing the top quotes of the conference

About this position:

MAC is seeking a video editor to edit and assemble recorded material into a 40-minute documentary video. Working closely with MAC and documentary producer Ron Duquette, you will follow the script and shot list to assemble the footage and perform requested edits to produce the final documentary video.

- A highlights video that summarizes the prescription related content in 5-10 minutes.
- *Additional video trailers may be requested.*

Required Skills/Equipment:

- Applicants must have their own computer and will be working remotely with their own equipment.
- Applicants must have their own access to and be familiar with video production editing software (Adobe Creative Suite or similar).
- Must have experience working as a freelance video editor in a professional environment, nonprofit or arts sector experience preferred.
- Must have the ability to work independently, meet deadlines, attend production meetings, and take direction from MAC staff and/or video producer.
- This position may require work on evenings/weekends, and a flexible schedule will be necessary.
