


## INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY


- •The term intellectual property refers to creations of the mind.
- •Intellectual property includes inventions, literary and artistic works, designs, and symbols, names and images used in commerce.
- •Intellectual property is protected in law by either trademarks, patents, or copyright. These laws allow people to be financially compensated for their intellectual property.

#### COPYRIGHT

- Copyright is a legal term used to describe the rights that creators have over their literary and artistic works.
- When you write a song, and that song is then fixed in a tangible form, such as a recording or sheet music, your song is then automatically protected by copyright.
- As the copyright author or rights holder, you alone have the exclusive rights to reproduce the work in various forms, to perform the work publicly, to record the work, to broadcast the work, to translate the work into other languages, or to adapt the work.







